## Maritime beef cattle breeders impress judges at 2007 New Brunswick Beef Expo

Sussex, NB – September 23, 2007 – Judges Paul and Jennifer Mastine of Melbourne, QC, were impressed with the quality of beef cattle exhibited during this year’s New Brunswick Beef Expo. The couple have been judging cattle for over ten years both internationally and across Canada, including the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto.

178 cattle, representative of seven different breeds of beef cattle, were exhibited over the week-end. Commenting on a group of young Angus cows, Paul Mastine said, “This is as sound a group of heifers as I’ve seen anywhere in the country this year.” He was similarly complimentary to the Salers, calling them “outstanding”.

Exhibitors came from the three Maritime Provinces and Quebec to show Angus, Hereford, Limousin, Saler, Shorthorn, Simmental and Crossbred cattle.

Sunday morning’s show featured future breeders of beef cattle in the Junior Beef Show. Starting with the Pee-Wee’s (4-8 year olds) through to the 18-21 year olds, these young cattle men and women demonstrated their Showmanship skills with enthusiasm and aplomb.

Next week-end the focus is back on horses as the NB Percheron Horse Association hosts the final Draft Horse show of the season.
